#### **TICKET EXCHANGES**

Tickets may be exchanged for any performance of the same production. **Tickets may be exchanged up to two hours prior to a performance.** Exchanges are subject to availability; we recommend that you make arrangements as early as possible.

Ticket prices vary according to subscription plans and performance dates. If you exchange into a higher-priced performance, you will be charged the appropriate difference in price. Exchanges into a lower-priced performance will not receive a refund for the difference.

If you are not sure which future performance you would like to attend at the time of exchange, we will hold the tickets at Will Call until you decide.

If you are unable to attend a show, you may donate your tickets back to City Theatre. We will provide you with a receipt for a tax-deductible contribution for the value of your ticket.

#### **FLEX PLANS**

#### **BASIC FLEX (TUESDAY - THURSDAY):**

Each voucher is redeemable for one ticket to any Tuesday through Thursday performance of the 2015–2016 Main Season. If you choose to attend a weekend performance (Friday through Sunday), you will be charged the difference in price.

#### PREMIUM FLEX (ANY DAY):

Each voucher is redeemable for one ticket to any performance of the 2015–2016 Main Season.

You may use your vouchers in any combination: all for one show, one each for six shows, or otherwise. Vouchers are redeemable by phone or in person. As seating is subject to availability, we recommend that you reserve your tickets in advance by calling the Box Office.

Flex vouchers may be redeemed for Main Season performances only. They may not be used to attend City Events or other special presentations.

#### LATE SEATING POLICY

Our theatres are very intimate. Out of respect for both the actors and audience, City Theatre does not accommodate late seating; please allow ample time for travel and parking.

**Late arrivals will not be seated.** If you arrive late and miss the performance, please contact the Box Office as soon as possible to discuss rescheduling options.

#### PARKING

City Theatre provides safe, convenient parking for \$7 via lot access at 1317 Bingham Street, across from the theatre entrance. Subscribers may purchase six parking vouchers for \$42 that guarantee parking for each performance.

**Parking is guaranteed for subscribers who have pre-paid parking vouchers.** If there are only enough parking spaces for subscribers with pre-paid vouchers on a given performance day, then only these cars will be admitted.

When you enter the parking lot, present your payment or voucher to the attendant. In the event that the attendant is not on site prior to the show, vouchers or payment will be collected upon exiting the lot after the performance.

Due to increased demand, the lot is often quite full. For this reason, upon entering, you may be asked to leave your keys with the attendant so that the maximum number of cars can be parked.

There is additional metered parking on the South Side along streets and in city-owned lots. Please allow yourself ample time to locate parking and reach City Theatre before show time.
