The play is written by **Conor McPherson**, and is directed by City Theatre Artistic Director **Tracy Brigden**, who is celebrating her 15th season as the Southside company's artistic leader.

Tommy has made a mess of things: he's living low in Dublin, just getting by on odd jobs, and doing his best to avoid his wife and kids. But when he rescues a mysterious woman, an escape out of the squalor is possible – if only they can shake their checkered pasts. This award-winning play ripples with humor and heart and wrestles with the complicated task of being human.

"I am so thrilled to once again present the beautiful work of Conor McPherson, one of Ireland's leading dramatists, to Pittsburgh audiences," says Ms. Brigden. "The Night Alive is a wonderfully funny, romantic, and suspenseful Irish yarn, with a glimmer of hope shining throughout. The Night Alive features Rod Brogan, Ciaran Byrne, and local talent Brendan Griffin, each making their City Theatre debuts; and returning City favorites Hayley Neilsen (last seen in City's box office hit Vanya and Sonia and Masha and Spike) and Noble Shropshire (Outside Mullingar).
