

City Theatre Young Playwrights In-School Workshop Application

What is City Theatre Young Playwrights?

City Theatre Young Playwrights is a comprehensive, dynamic approach to arts education serving teachers, students, and the Pittsburgh community. In the Young Playwrights model, a City Theatre Teaching Artist is paired with the Classroom Teacher—creating the Artistic Team for an exciting partnership that guides students through the playwriting process during classroom workshops.

City Theatre Young Playwrights workshops:

- Help students of all abilities to achieve their fullest potential.
- ♦ Engage students from varied grade levels, geographic areas and curricular entry points.
- Enhance students' writing skills, and provide them with a variety of strategies for writing and revision that can be used in other genres of writing.
- Give students a new medium through which they can explore and express themselves.
- Strengthen reading, listening, and speaking skills.
- ◆ Develop skills in problem-solving, decision-making, critical thinking, and goal-setting.
- ♦ Promote cultural awareness, acceptance, and inclusion.
- Build self-confidence and self-esteem.
- Encourage the development of a classroom environment that is respectful, supportive, and safe for all.
- ♦ Involve students in a long term, multi-phase, complex project.
- Fulfill state and national standards, including:
 - PA Core- English Language Arts
 - PA Arts and Humanities Standards (9.1 through 9.4)

The workshops are student-centered, involving young people in hands-on activities that incorporate the class as a whole and stress the idea of an ensemble environment. The Artistic Team engages students in writing and revising activities, including writing conferences and theatre techniques such as improvisation and performance. All subject areas and life experiences are material the students can shape artistically to create an original work.

Throughout the workshops, playwriting can be used in many ways—not only integrated into a language arts curriculum, but as a teaching tool to aid students in learning content material such as history, world cultures, science, and math. Young Playwrights workshops can be individually tailored to each teacher's classroom and curricular needs. Students are encouraged to maintain portfolios and journals, learning to reflect on and evaluate their own work. Student playwrights receive numerous opportunities for individualized feedback and revision suggestions. Students also critique their own scripts, as well as support and evaluate the work of their classmates.

When would classroom visits take place?

The Teaching Artist makes multiple visits to the classroom beginning in mid to late fall (totaling 20 hours of classroom time, including instruction and individual conferencing time with students) and through the winter months leading up to the Young Playwrights Contest deadline of March 2017. Specific scheduling of visits is done in conjunction with the classroom teacher and according to school schedule and logistics.

What is expected of the classroom teacher?

The Classroom Teacher will be expected to communicate regularly with the Teaching Artist and set aside time for planning sessions to assess student progress, and strategize for future workshops. The Classroom Teacher will be expected to reinforce concepts and maintain a consistency and flow between visits of the Teaching Artist. *Classroom Teachers will need to attend the 2016 Young Playwrights Teacher Institute or have attended the Institute in the past two years.* We ask that Classroom Teachers internally publicize the City Theatre Young Playwrights program to appropriate school and district administration and staff and encourage inclusion of the program in appropriate newsletters and other school related media. Teachers should also plan on bringing their students to experience the City Theatre's Young Playwrights Festival which will be held in November/December 2016 at City Theatre (special student matinee ticket prices are available).

How much does it cost?

The cost of a City Theatre Young Playwrights In-School Workshop placement covers all Teaching Artist fees. The cost of the program for one classroom of students (no less than 15 but not to exceed 30 in number) is \$950.00. Two classrooms at the same school is \$1,800. Attendance to the Teachers Institute is an additional \$50.00 per teacher.
