**Pittsburgh**, **PA** (March 15, 2018) – Continuing a run of new works on the South Side, **City Theatre** is proud to present the second-ever production of **The White Chip by Sean Daniels** (director of *The Lion*, City Theatre, 2016; Artistic Director of Merrimack Repertory Theatre). A highly-theatrical and often comic journey through Daniels' real-life struggles with alcoholism, the play features a cast of three: one actor who plays Sean, and two who represent the various voices of reason—and chaos—in his life. It is **directed by Sheryl Kaller** (Tony Award Best Director Nominee: *Next Fall*) and will run in the **Lester Hamburg Studio**, **April 7 – May 6, 2018**. Tickets are on sale now.

**About The White Chip:** Sean is on top of the world: he's married, has good friends, and is steps away from his dream job running one of the hottest theaters in the country. He also happens to be an alcoholic spinning out of control. The White Chip follows his life from first sip to first love, critical hit to critical care, all the way to rock bottom where he carves an unusual path to sobriety. This highly entertaining autobiographical tale from director Sean Daniels is a wry and wild theatrical journey to recovery.

"My instinct for writing The White Chip was—when I was trying to get sober and worried that I would die if I didn't find something that would help me—that I couldn't find anything that felt like it was now, that felt like it was current, that felt like it was funny or had a sense of humor. Everything was very kind of 1920s, very kind of old school AA, and I thought, alright well, if I make it through this, I have to write the thing I can't find," said **playwright Sean Daniels**, speaking to the company at first rehearsal. "And so when I got through it, I thought, well that was the promise I made, now I have to actually do it and began working on it and putting this play together.

"What I am so moved by now, is that it feels like it's a time when the idea of embracing science is a revolutionary idea—facts are up for debate, which facts we want to believe and which facts we choose

not to—and we are doing a play that says 'No, facts are actually facts, and if you can believe in them, they can actually save your life," he continued. "So I'm grateful to be doing this now, because it feels like it is important for me to be able to say to other people: there are many ways in which you don't have to die... There's a possibility of embracing the things that we should know in 2018 that aren't a mystery; that really—with a greater support system and greater knowledge in the world—fewer people have to die."

**City Theatre continues its season-long commitment to community engagement with Familylinks.** Patrons are invited to bring donations of art supplies to support the art therapy program at Familylinks and the organization will host a talkback discussion about addiction on Sunday, April 15 following the 2:00 p.m. matinee.

The White Chip is directed by Sheryl Kaller. The cast includes Kyle Cameron as Sean, Daina Michelle Griffith as #1, and Daniel Krell as #2. Hank Bullington is scenic designer, Robert C.T. Steele is costume designer, Andrew David Ostrowski is lighting designer, Leon Rothenberg is sound designer, Julie Felise Dubiner provided original illustrations, and Taylor Meszaros is stage manager; casting by Lauren Port, C.S.A. It is produced in association with Tom Kirdahy, Hunter Arnold & Sally Cade Holmes.

**Sean Daniels** has had his writing produced and developed at Actors Theatre of Louisville, New York Stage and Film, Merrimack Repertory Theatre, Theatrical Outfit, and Dad's Garage. He is the Artistic Director of Merrimack Repertory Theatre. He's previously served as the Artist-At-Large for Geva Theatre Center and spent four years at the Tony Award-winning Actors Theatre of Louisville as the theatre's Associate Artistic Director (where he directed 17 productions including five Humana Festivals). Mr. Daniels is the former Associate Artistic Director/Resident Director of the California Shakespeare Theater and before that spent a decade as the Artistic Director and Co-Founder of Dad's Garage Theater Company in Atlanta.
